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## 16 SCIENCE CENTRE ◀

Designed by Indian architect Charles Correa, Lisbon's Champalimaud Centre for the Unknown is the new HQ of a foundation dedicated to cutting-edge neuroscience and cancer research. It is located on a 60,000 sq m waterfront site from where 16th-century Portuguese navigators set sail to discover the world. Composed of two volumes – one houses the research facilities, the other an auditorium – linked by a glass bridge, the building is surrounded by landscaped gardens, an open-air amphitheatre and a waterfront promenade accessible to all.
